This funding will be used to

- Guarantee that every student will meet national minimum standards for their year level or have an evidence based learning plan to address their specific learning needs.
- Increase percentage of students in NAPLAN U2B
- Literacy – 30% Year 3 students & 25% Year 5 students
- Numeracy - 20% - Year 3 & 5 students
- Reduced the percentage of Students at risk of achieving D or E in English from 35% to 25%.
- Increase average % of students achieving an A in Science – from 7.8% 2018 to 10%
- Increase language and cognitive skills in early years – reduce from 29.3% to 20% at risk & 10.3% to 5% vulnerable - AEDC

• Our initiatives include

- Develop a **curriculum leadership team** to build staff capacity to embed the practices in the school's Pedagogical Framework (*The New Art and Science of Teaching – Robert Marzano*)
- **Professional Learning Community** practice (Dufour, Muhammad, Mathis) that will direct collaborative data analysis and improved instructional practice with a focus on Response to Intervention processes and weekly data cycles in English.
- Continue to deliver a **STEAM** program with a focus on Science, Mathematics and Creative and Critical thinking to engage and extend students.
- Student wellbeing support initiatives to enable improved student outcomes.– Pathways to Resilience/Expressive Arts Psychotherapy
