- Reduced the percentage of Students at risk of achieving D or E in English from 30% to 20%.
- Increase the percentage of students in Year 1-3 achieving year level expectations in reading from 58% to 70%
- Reduce School Disciplinary Absences
- Support staff to create calm and connected classrooms
- Support staff to authentically collaborate to improve instruction.

- Support early literacy development through the **Early Learning & Literacy Program**.
- Explore the research of Lyn Sharratt to increase the growth and achievement in all students through a **learning collaborative** with other schools in our region.
- Creating a **Managing complex behaviour strategy** through the collaboration with the school Responsible Behaviour Team.
- Embed the **Pathways to Resilience** – Calm & Connection classroom plans to assist students to regulate their behaviour and engage in learning.
